OUR VISION

The Nazareth Trust is a Christian organisation, aiming to reach out to the local population and to the wider world, irrespective of faith, political persuasion or tradition, through healthcare, education, proclamation and service.

OUR HISTORY

In 1861, a small medical mission was established in Nazareth to provide essential medical services. 155 years later, the core element of that mission, to meet the healthcare needs of the local community, remains central to our work.

Over time we have grown. Today, the Nazareth Trust comprises a busy general hospital, an academically acclaimed nursing college, a vibrant short-term missionary programme and an internationally renowned first-century, open-air biblical museum known as "Nazareth Village".





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Throughout its history, the region has known much conflict, political change, division and social unrest. Likewise, both the hospital and nursing college have adapted: changing from traditional, expatriate-led 'missions' to effective contributors within the modern Israeli healthcare and educational landscape. As such, staff, and those who access services, come from all faiths and communities. The Nazareth Trust retains a commitment to the needs of the local and extended Palestinian Arab population - and within that, a particular intent to offer support to the Palestinian Arab Christian community.

In recognition of its work over many years, the Israeli parliament gave its annual award for valued contribution to the nation to Nazareth hospital in 2012 - the first time the award was made to a non-Jewish organisation.

The accompanying citation noted that "the work of this old respected institution is based on the values of compassion and love for all people...", that it "treats everybody the same since they were created in the image of God". Although much has changed over our history, our motivation remains to express the love of God, and the truth of the gospel in word and deed, and to do so in dependence on Him.

OUR SERVICES

Nazareth Hospital EMMS

Licensed for 150 beds and comprising just under 500 staff, the hospital has a 24 hour emergency room, and provides a wide range of services including surgery, maternity, paediatrics, psychiatry and intensive care. There is a busy renal dialysis service, a neonatal unit and a modern cardiac catheterisation suite. The hospital, which is affiliated with the Bar Ilan Medical School, maintains education, training and research programmes.

Nazareth Village

The Nazareth village gives the opportunity to experience Nazareth as it was in the first century. Tour guides share Biblical stories in a variety of languages and bring the bible to life using the working farm, traditional synagogue building and authentic meals as a backdrop. Welcoming around 90,000 visitors per year from over 105 countries, the village is well known within the global Christian family.

Nazareth Nursing College

Established over 90 years ago, the college primarily focuses on providing vocational education within the Arab community. On average per academic year, 300 students work towards their nursing diploma or BA nursing degree, with a vast majority being Israeli Arab students.

SERVE Nazareth

SERVE provides volunteer ministry opportunities in Northern Galilee, enhancing our work in Nazareth or through supporting local Christian ministries. For every volunteer, time with SERVE is a time of growth: both developing personal, spiritual skills in ministry and furthering the mission of the Nazareth Trust.

OUR CHALLENGES

As a private healthcare provider, it is easily assumed that we do not require external support. However, like many healthcare providers worldwide, we are facing considerable financial challenges. Rising demand for services alongside a desire to address health inequalities amongst the Arab population, means we must substantially increase our fundraising capacity - not only for establishing new medical services, but also to develop our Christian mission.






The Nursing College, SERVE and Nazareth village are principally resourced through the income of their respective service users. The Nazareth Hospital operates within the Israeli health service and is funded through service contracts. However, as a non-government hospital, funding for capital developments and equipment is required to be found from external sources.

Therefore, the Nazareth Trust recognises that future development depends on building support from a range of individual and organisation donors, primarily from the UK, USA and Israel. It is our aim to raise \$1M worth of unrestricted funds to support development across the organisation, with the aim of establishing new services in areas of need. It is also our intention to embark on a major capital development programme, possibly costing as much as \$100m over the next 7 years.


